
SAXMUNDHAM MUSEUM

Visitor Numbers Top 1,500!

We are thrilled to report that the Museum welcomed over 1,500 individual visitors during the summer. Their donations helped enormously with the ongoing running costs associated with the Museum. It costs over £4,000 per year to keep the Museum ticking over (utilities, rent, rates, insurances, etc) and that is before any abnormal / capital costs are taken into consideration.

At the start of year we repainted the frontage to the Museum and we hope to make big improvements to the signage in the town in 2016 to further increase visitor numbers. We are indebted to Saxmundham Town Council who donated a grant of £800 to the Museum earlier this year.

As ever, a huge thank you is owed to Olive Warren and her team of willing volunteers who give up so much of their time in their vital role as stewards.

Ron Thompson



This year, the Museum posted a special exhibit about Ron Thompson, a stalwart of the Saxmundham community who spent much of the Second World War as a Japanese Prisoner of War.

Ron Thompson was born in Dennington in 1921 and moved to Albion Street, Saxmundham as a small boy. His father worked at Bower's Coal Merchants.

He joined the army when he was 18 and was posted to the Far East almost straight away to

work on the infamous Burma railway. He was captured by the Japanese and interned in Changi jail between 1942 and 1945.

After the War, he worked for Reades of Aldeburgh as a builder and plasterer, travelling between jobs on his motorbike.

Ron Thompson passed away in May this year. He is survived by his wife, Dorothy, and their sons Stephen and Christopher.
